**Topic s to be covered:**

- \*Child Development theorists
- \*parent and child rights
- \*personal readiness, are you ready to be a parent?
- \*reasons people choose to have children
- \*teen pregnancy/parenting
- \*STDs
- \*birth control methods
- \*prenatal development
- \*labor and delivery

**PowerPoint must include the following:**

- minimum of 25 slides, no maximum (25 points)
- minimum of 10 pictures that are relevant to the topics, no maximum, a slide with just a picture will not count towards your 25 slide total (20 points)
- information about topics: (150 pts)
  - \*definition of each topic
  - \*details of each topic
  - \*specific examples of each topic
- the 1<sup>st</sup> slide needs to be a title slide with your title, class, and your name (5 points)
- the last slide needs to be a work cited slide (10 points)**
- PowerPoint must be easy to read, organized and well-researched (20 points)
- must use in-class work days productively (20 pts)

During the presentation each student will go through their PowerPoint with the class, answering questions and facilitating discussion.
