Mechanics

ORDER (25 Points) -Body of paper MUST follow the order of this rubric!

GRAMMAR (20 points)

- -No more than 2 errors each of spelling, punctuation, or grammar
- -No contractions, abbreviations, or slang; these will be considered grammar errors
- -Paper is easy to understand, transitions smoothly, and in logical order
- -Spell check, proof read and have someone else read your paper for errors!

INTRODUCTION (20 points)

- -The introduction is its own paragraph.
- -Paragraph starts with an attention-grabbing statement.
- -Includes a thesis statement (does not have to be the 1st sentence); statement of purpose of the paper.
- -None of the points under the BODY section should be in the introduction!

SUMMARY (15 points)

- -Short summary of the information given on the career you researched.
- -Tie all the information together!
- -Concluding statement, end the paper.
- -Are you still interested in this career, why or why not?

BODY (120 points): This is the CONTENT!!!

-Must include the following information for your career choice IN THE FOLLOWING ORDER:

- (5) -Name of career and why you are interested in researching this career.
- (5) -How does this career match with your skills? What do you do well NOW that makes this career a fit for you?
- (5) -Brief history of the occupation (how it started, how it has evolved).
- (5) -Description of the career (nature of the work, general over-all picture of what you do in this career)
- (5) -Basic duties performed on a typical workday.
- (10) -What the workplace looks like, what are the working conditions and typical hours?
- (5) -Skills needed for the occupation, what will you need to be able to do?
- -Specific education/ training needed, how many years & what type of program/degree do you need, and licensure or certification information if applicable, if continuing education is required
- (15) -Beginning, median and high end salary; specify if this is national or lowa specific data.
- (30) -Rewards and sacrifices, at least 3 of each, and the reasoning behind why you think so
- (5) -Job outlook and trends, what is the prediction of how many job openings there will be in the future.
- -What are at least 3 related occupations to the career you researched and give a brief description of each?

SOURCES (45 points) Noodle Tools website may be helpful!

- -Use proper MLA formatting for all parenthetical citations and the Works Cited page entries (including hanging indent).
- -Minimum of 3 sources, 1 MUST be a BOOK!
- -ALL sources must be cited in the text of the paper and included on the Works Cited page.
- -Use only approved on-line sources, found on Mrs. Erb's website (Classroom Information/Important Links).
- -Works Cited page included, must be its own page (not included in the 3 page minimum), with appropriate heading (words
- "Works Cited" centered, no bolding or underlines), double-spaced, same font as paper, entries are alphabetized.

PRESENTATION (100 points, 70 from content, 30 from the visual aids and time)

- -Give a brief run-down of the career you researched to the class, summarize the main points
 - -summarize the research from your paper, include all points from the body of the paper.
- -You may use up to 3 note cards, but may **NOT** take your paper up with you to present.
- -Need at least 2 visual aids; uniform, guest speaker, books, Prezi, Google presentation, pamphlet, poster, video clip, other props (books, tools of the trade, etc.). Use your creativity!!

 -Please schedule guest speakers with me
- -Presentation must be a minimum of 5 minutes!
